1997-1999

- Feasibility study for carbon sequestration project in Aceh (Exxon Mobil).
- Consultations resulted in identifying need for a broad-based multi-stakeholder conservation and community development strategy. traditional natural resource management plans made in Aceh to provide an advisory service to support information.

Joint Commitment

DECEMBER 2002

Free Aceh Movement and Government of Indonesia signed a cease-fire agreement.

- free elections 2004
- 70% of oil, gas, mineral foregone in new provincial government

NEW OPPORTUNITIES to work with the provincial and local government for long-term conservation and development.

- CI again made plans to establish a presence Aceh.
- CEPF funding CI and partner work in Aceh.

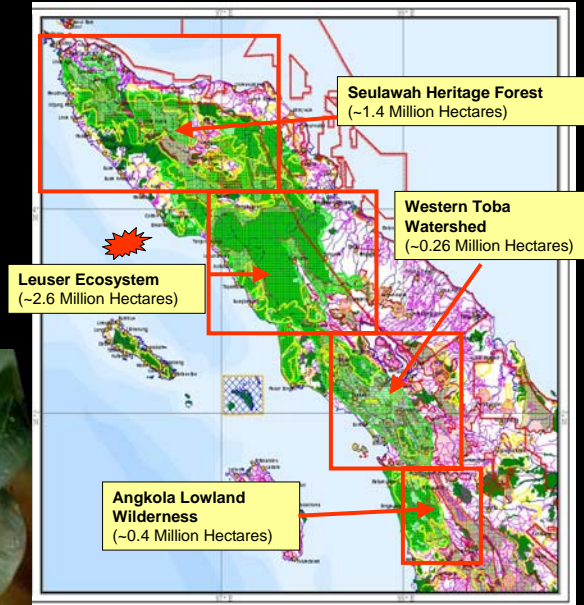

CI and CEPF Tsunami Relief Efforts

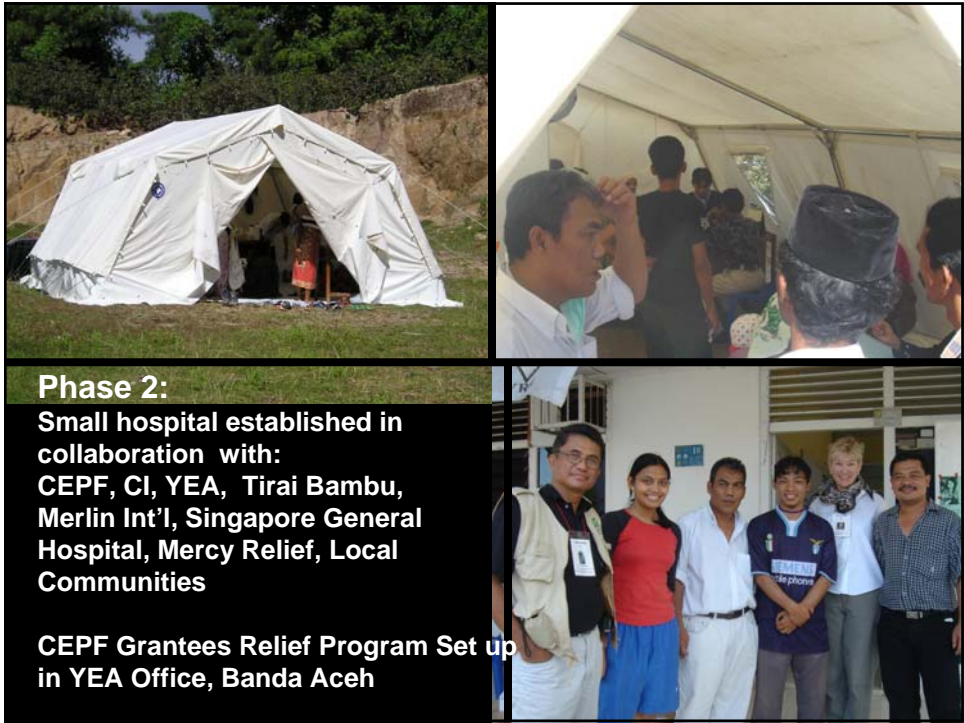
Phase 1 – Jan-Feb 2005

Spearheaded relief program with two NGO consortia in North Sumatra (WALHI, YLL) with support from CI, CEPF, and United in Diversity

More than 40 CI and volunteers helped relief efforts in Banda Aceh and Meulaboh 1st & 2nd week after Tsunami

CEPF Leaders (CI, WWF and WCS) collaborated to send Community Facilitators for Aceh from Lampung, Padang, Riau, Medan and Jakarta





FRINGING REEFS AND MANGROVES PROTECT COASTLINES

April 05: Revisited CI's Corral Reef 2001 surveyed in Banda Aceh; 70% survey sites damaged by Tsunami

CI will work closely with Min. Forestry on Mangrove rehabilitation in Krueng Raya with community




CI Commitments in ACEH:

Together with WWF, FFI, Walhi and local NGOs will monitor Illegal Logging, Forest conversion The use of Timber for Reconstruction

Together with WCS will help detecting any forest cover changes in Aceh

Together with WWF and AF&PA will seek to find legal timber For reconstruction and looking for Donation "Timber For Aceh (TFA) program"

Together with Counterpart Int'l, ForestTrade, Starbuck, Mountain Green Coffee to revive Gayo shaded coffee (2000 farmers) to reduce forest encroachment





Timber For Aceh (WWF & CI)

- Need of Timber: 6 million M3 of 5 years
- Sources:
 - From Aceh will create Deforestation, only 9 logging Companies operate but illegal logging start booming (41 sawmills detected)
 - National Sources: Possible from certified industries (only a few available mostly exported products) and community forestry (?).
 - Likely will come from illegal woods from all over Indonesia

Imported:

Donation from AF&PA (US): First shipment: 5000 m3 s in July from US and more coming from other countries helped by WWF Australia, Europe and Canada.
